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Ensure that any cables that cross the floor to the appliance are properly bundled and marked to avoid a trip hazard.

The SMART AM60 appliance is Google EDLA certified and can be installed in compatible SMART Board interactive displays to provide a Google-based user experience and the benefits of the latest version of SMART's iQ<sup>1</sup>.

Featuring integrated Google with Play Certification, the AM60 appliance lets users access native Google apps and the Play store without connecting an external computer. Adding a Google account enables access to Google Drive and your YouTube account, plus easy access to Google Classroom, Docs, Slides, and Sheets.

The AM60 appliance also comes with the latest Android OS and includes an upgrade path to future Android updates via over-the-air updates.

# Chapter 2 Installing

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 Turning on the appliance for the first time
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## Installing the AM60 appliance

### A Caution

Do not install or remove the appliance while the display is turned on. Ensure the power switch on the back of the display beside the AC power inlet is in the OFF (O) position.

#### Note

Support for the AM60 may vary by SMART Board interactive display series.

You or your organization's installers can install the AM60 appliance in a supported SMART Board interactive display's accessory slot by following the instructions in the appliance's illustrated installation instructions.



## Connecting to a network

The appliance requires a network and internet connection for downloading software and firmware updates. The display's network connection is shared internally with the appliance, or you can connect the appliance to a network independently of the display using the appliance's Wi-Fi connection or RJ45 jack.

If the display is connected to a network (either Wi-Fi or Ethernet), the appliance will use the display's network connection by default. If the appliance is connected directly to Wi-Fi or Ethernet independently of the display, this connection will override the display's network connection.

## Turning on the appliance for the first time

#### () Important

Install the appliance before you turn on the display.

#### Notes

• The on-screen instructions for completing the appliance's setup include an option for adding a user's Google account credentials. You can skip this option if you have concerns about privacy when multiple users are accessing the display. You can enter your Google account credentials after setting up the appliance by accessing Settings.

- 1. Turn on the display and wait for the home screen to appear.
- 2. View the available inputs and select the appliance.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the appliance setup.

# Chapter 3 **Connecting devices**

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
This chapter includes information about connecting devices to the AM60 appliance.

## Connecting computers

### () Warning

Ensure that any cables that cross the floor to the appliance are properly bundled and marked to avoid a trip hazard.

You can connect a room computer or guest laptop to the appliance and view and interact with them.



HDMI-IN and Touch (USB type-B)

### (i) Warning

Ensure that any cables that cross the floor to the display are properly bundled and marked to avoid a trip hazard.

#### Notes

- Install SMART software on computers you connect to the display.
- Your organization's installers might have connected cables to the display and run the cables behind a wall or under the floor to a desk or table where you can place your computer.

#### Note

The USB Type-C receptacle is not suitable for charging devices.

### Viewing a connected computer's input

- 1. Connect the computer to the appliance.
- 2. View the appliance's input.

3. Open the Toolbar by tapping the Toolbar menu button at the bottom of the screen.

4. Tap the **Input** icon.

Tip

Tap the **Tools** icon to find the Input icon if it doesn't appear in the Toolbar's list of Favorite widgets.

5. Tap the computer's input.

## Setting a connected computer's resolution and refresh rate

This table presents the recommend resolutions and refresh rates for the display's inputs:

Input source	Resolution	Refresh rate
HDMI	3840 × 2160	60 Hz
USB Type-C	3840 × 2160	60 Hz

If possible, set connected computers to these resolutions and refresh rates. See the computers' operating system documentation for instructions.

## About resolutions

The appliance supports full high definition (FHD) 1080p and 4K ultra high definition (4K UHD) resolutions, provided the source device meets the minimum requirements for such resolutions.

Resolution	Pixels	Details
FHD (1080p)	1920 × 1080 (2.1 megapixels)	Most modern video devices (computers, laptops, DVD players, and Blu-ray™ disc players) support FHD resolutions. Check a device's specifications to see which resolutions it supports.

4K UHD	3840 × 2160 (8.3 megapixels)	A 4K UHD display has greater pixel density than an FHD display. A 4K UHD display can show up to four times as much visual information as FHD displays.

## About refresh rates

Displays can support different refresh rates, typically 30 Hz or 60 Hz. Higher refresh rates can result in smoother, flicker-free video. This is most evident when using 4K UHD.

Most computers support a refresh rate of 60 Hz. Using the highest frame refresh rate possible will result in a better experience when using the SMART product, provided the connected device supports the refresh rate. If it doesn't, you may need to set the device's display settings to a lower refresh rate.

## Using recommended cables

SMART recommends the following varieties of cable:

Cable type	Maximum length	Recommendation
HDMI	23' (7 m)1	Use only certified Premium High-Speed HDMI (18 Gpbs) cables that have been tested to support the performance standard you require.
Stereo 3.5 mm	20' (6 m)	[N/A]

<sup>1</sup>The performance of cables longer than 23' (7 m) is highly dependent on the cable's quality.

USB 2.0	16' (5 m)	Use a USB extender if the distance between the computer and the display is greater than 16' (5 m).

Using cables that exceed these maximum lengths may produce unexpected results, intermittent loss of picture, or degraded picture quality and USB connectivity.


## Connecting other devices

## (i) Warning

Ensure that any cables that cross the floor to the appliance are properly bundled and marked to avoid a trip hazard.

## Connecting USB drives, peripherals, and other devices

You can use USB drives, peripherals, and other devices with the appliance by connecting those devices to the appliance's USB 3.1 Type-A, USB 3.1 Type-B, and USB Type-C receptacles.




Alternatively, you can connect USB devices to the USB receptacles on the display. For information about the type and location of USB receptacles on the display, see the display's documentation.

#### Note

The USB Type-C receptacle is not suitable for charging devices.

## Connecting external displays

You can connect an external display to the HDMI out connector on the appliance (rather than the HDMI out connector on the display). This allows you to duplicate or extend the appliance's desktop to the external display.




## Connecting an external audio system

The appliance includes two stereo 3.5 mm connectors for connecting external analog audio devices.


You can connect the appliance to an externally powered analog audio system using the stereo 3.5 mm Audio OUT connector. You might want to connect an external audio system if you're providing sound in a larger space.

#### Note

Connecting the appliance to an external audio disables the display's internal speakers.



You can also connect the appliance to an external audio source using the stereo 3.5 mm Audio IN connector. Sound from the external audio source will play through the display's speakers.



## Installing a microSD card

You can use a microSD card to increase the appliance's internal storage capacity. The microSD card's storage can be combined with the appliance's internal storage so you can save additional files, media, and apps on the appliance. You can also format the microSD card for portable storage.

#### Note

When you format an SD card for portable storage, you can't install apps on the SD card or transfer the SD card between devices.

SMART recommends a name brand microSD card that has the following specifications:

- SDHC or SDXC flash memory
- Up to 80 MB/s transfer speed
- U1 or higher UHS speed class
- C10 or higher video speed class
- Single partition


#### To increase the appliance's storage capacity

### / Caution

Do not install or remove the appliance while the display is turned on. Ensure the power switch on the back of the display beside the AC power inlet is in the OFF (O) position. Using only the display's Power button is not sufficient.

If the appliance is installed in the display, turn the display off by turning the power switch to the OFF
 (O) position. (This switch's position varies among models of display. Check your display's support
 site pages for help finding the switch, if necessary.) Remove the appliance from the display.

2. Insert a microSD card into the appliance's SD card slot.



- 3. Install the appliance in the display, and turn the display back on.
- 4. Open the display's input menu and select the appliance input source.

A small SD card icon will appear in the top-left corner of the appliances Home screen when the SD card is installed.

- 5. Go to **Settings** > **Storage**, open the drop-down menu at the top of the screen, and tap **SD-CARD**.
- 6. Tap the menu icon in the top-right corner of the Storage settings window to access options for formatting the SD card.
- 7. Choose either of the following options:

### A Caution

After the microSD card is formatted for internal storage, the appliance will distribute applications and data across all internal memory. Removing the microSD card after formatting for internal storage will result in data loss.


- **Format**: The SD card is formatted as a separate storage device and is managed manually.
- **Format as internal**: The SD card is combined with the appliance's internal memory and managed automatically.
- 8. Follow the on-screen instructions to format the SD card.

9. Verify that the SD card was added successfully by going to **Settings** > **Storage**. Depending on how the SD card was formatted, the additional storage will be added to the appliance's internal storage or be listed as an additional storage option.

## Viewing the appliance's input

After installing and setting up the appliance, you can view the appliance's input on the display.

1. Open the display's input menu.

## Opening the Input settings menu

1. Open the **Toolbar** by tapping the Toolbar menu button **at the bottom of the screen**.

2. Tap the **Input** icon.



## Managing network and internet settings

Change network and internet settings, such as configuring the appliance's Ethernet and Wi-Fi settings. You can also configure the appliance's Bluetooth settings.

#### To manage network and internet settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Network & internet**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Internet	Access options for connecting the appliance to a Wi-Fi network. When Wi-Fi is enabled, the appliance will scan and displays the names of available Wi-Fi networks.
	When the appliance is connected to a Wi-Fi network, 🖤 appears in the upper-right corner of the appliance's Home screen.
Ethernet	Access options for connecting the appliance to an Ethernet network.
Hotspot & tethering	Configure hotspot and tethering options to enable internet access for other devices through the appliance's network connection.
VPN	Configure a virtual private network for the appliance.

## Managing connected device settings

Change settings for connected devices, such as configuring a Bluetooth mouse, keyboard, sound bar, and more.

#### To manage connected device settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Connected devices**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Pair new device	Connect a Bluetooth enabled device such as a mouse, keyboard, or headset.
See all	View a list of all previously paired Bluetooth devices.
Connection preferences	Configure different types of connections, such as Bluetooth, casting, and Android Beam.

## Configuring individual app permissions

See which applications are installed, check their permissions and storage, and more.

#### To configure individual app permissions

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Apps**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Recently opened apps	View a list of recently opened apps.
General	Assign a default internet browser, media player, and so on. View a list of unused apps and apps that require special access configuration.

## Managing app notification settings

Change notification settings for certain apps or for general device notifications. Swipe down from the top of the screen to view notifications. Some notifications can also appear on your lock screen and home screen.

#### To manage notification settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Notifications**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
App settings	Control notifications from individual apps.
Notification history	Show recent and temporarily disabled notifications.
Device & app notifications	Control which apps and devices can respond to notifications.
Notifications on lock screen	Control which notifications can appear on the lock screen (including hiding all notifications).
Do Not Disturb	Choose to receive notifications from only certain apps or users.

## Accessing storage information

See how much space is being used and how much is being devoted to categories such as apps, images, and videos.

#### To access storage information

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Storage**.
- 2. The following file storage information is available:

Option	Description
Available storage total	View the current available storage capacity of the appliance's internal memory. If a microSD card is installed into the SD card slot on the appliance,
	depending on how the SD card was formatted, the additional storage capacity will be added to the appliance's internal storage or be listed as an additional storage option.
Storage manager	Enable the ability to automatically free up storage space in the appliance's memory.
Free up space	Go to the Files app to manage and free up storage space in the appliance's memory.
General storage information	View how much storage space in the appliance's memory is being devoted to categories such as apps, images, and videos.

## Managing display settings

Change display settings, such as configuring screen brightness, themes, lock screen preferences, and timeout settings.

#### To manage display settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Display**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Lock screen	Configure lock screen settings (including whether notifications are displayed when the lock screen is enabled and whether users can be added from the lock screen).
Screen timeout	Set the time before the lock screen appears (if enabled).
Dark theme	Enables a dark background for screen elements.
HDMI Out Format	Configure the output connector video resolution settings.
HDMI IN Format	Enable HDMI-CEC or HDMI-ARC functionality.
TYPEC OUT Format	Configure the output connector video resolution settings.
Screensaver	Enable a screensaver.
Display size and text	Change the display and font sizes.

## Managing wallpaper settings

Change the wallpaper that appears in the background and when the lockscreen is enabled.

#### To manage wallpaper settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Wallpaper**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Change wallpaper	Select the wallpaper that appears in the background and when the screen lock is enabled. Choose from included templates or download images and select them as wallpaper.
Dark theme	Enables screen elements to appear on a dark background rather than the default light screen.
Themed icons	Changes the appearance of Google app icons to have a monochrome appearance.

### Managing security settings

Set up a screen lock to help secure your appliance. You can also view information about the appliance's security status, including whether the appliance's Android system software version is up to date.

#### To manage password and account settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Security**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage:

Option	Description
Security status	Google Play Protect regularly checks your apps and the appliance for harmful behavior. You'll be notified if any security risks are found. Also, you can view details of when the Android system software (including security enhancements) was last updated.
Device security	Set up a screen lock to help secure the appliance from unauthorized access. Each time you turn on the appliance or wake up the screen, you'll be asked to unlock the appliance, with a swipe, PIN, pattern, or password.

## Managing password and account settings

Change password and account settings, such as saved passwords, autofill services, and synced accounts.

#### To manage password and account settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **Passwords & accounts**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description
Passwords	Manage passwords for online and cloud storage accounts.
Autofill service	Enable the appliance to remember account credentials (for Google, email accounts, and so on)
Accounts for Owner	Manage or add user accounts added to the appliance.
Add account	Add an account to the appliance to access your email, contacts, and calendar, and to get apps from the Google Play Store.
Automatically sync app data	Enable apps to refresh their data automatically.

### Managing system settings

Apply updates to the appliance's software and the appliance's Android system software. Change system settings, such as the appliance's interface language, individual app languages, and more.

#### To manage system settings

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **System**.
- 2. Select the setting you'd like to manage. Options available include:

Option	Description	
System update	Check for and apply updates to the Android system software.	
Software update	Check for and apply updates to the appliance's software.	
Language & input	Set the appliance's interface language.	
App Languages Set individual app languages.		
Keyboards	Set the onscreen keyboard language.	

## Accessing information about the appliance

See information about the appliance, such as the device name, the current Android version, network and hardware information, and more.

### To access information about the appliance

- 1. In the Settings window, tap **About**.
- 2. The following information about the appliance is available:

Device name	Shows the appliance's name.

Legal and regulatory	Shows legal and regulatory information about the appliance.
Model	Shows the appliance's model number.
Android version	Shows the current version of the appliance's Android operating system.
IP address	Shows the appliance's assigned network address.
Wi-Fi MAC address	Shows the MAC address of the appliance's Wi-Fi adapter.
Bluetooth address	Shows the appliance's unique identifier as a Bluetooth device.
Uptime	Shows the running time of the appliance since it was restarted.
Build number	Shows build information for the current version of the appliance's system firmware.
Version	Shows the current operating system software version.


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## Navigating the appliance's home screen



2	Press and hold the display image and then drag it to a new position.

## Using Screen lock

Use the Screen lock feature to secure the display's screen. When Screen lock is enabled, you can unlock the screen by swiping or by entering a PIN, pattern, or password.

You can create a Screen lock passcode during the appliance's initial set up. You can also configure the Screen lock feature in appliance settings.




Go to the Google Play store to download commonly used apps. Begin by tapping the Google Play store icon on the desktop (enter your Google account credentials if prompted):




If the Google Play store icon doesn't appear on the desktop, tap the Google apps folder and browse to the Google Play store icon.




